Welcome to 2023. As you will see in the Operations report, I am pleased to say that 2022 was a much better year for us and we were able to run a near full number of trips. We are looking forward to our 2023 season and are hoping that Covid (or indeed anything else) does not in any way restrict our service.

The new website is up and running well. The booking page is currently under review to see if we can make is easier for our clients to book their trips that way. However, I must point out that there were instances in 2022 were some groups booked for a full boat of 12 but only came to the boat on their day with 3 or 4; this is just not fair to other clients that we could have put on the boat to fill the boat up for that trip. It is ESSENTIAL that if any group is going to amend the numbers going, then they MUST give the booking Secretary sufficient notice of that fact.

Again, because of Covid, we have not been able to do any fundraising and we can only thank our donors, and in particular Rockfish Restaurants (Poole), who

have helped keep Dolphin afloat over this difficult period. I must also mention our sincere and grateful thanks to our two stalwart Fundraisers Barbara Gardner and Margaret Newman who have tirelessly continued to work on behind the scenes, and I now point you to the Fundraising report. A very BIG Thank you to Barbara and Margaret.

A BIG PLEA: We are always looking for volunteers to join our Charity, both for crewing but particularly for our Fund raising team; without them, we just could not function. None of us are getting any younger, and it is imperative that we get some 'younger blood' to join us and help this worthy Charity to continue far into the future. Anyone who would be willing to help us or at least give us some of their time, please get in touch with Tony Elgar for Fundraising and Steve Quinlan if you are volunteering for crew.

## **Chair of Operations Report February 2023**

The 2022 season got off to a slow start with an apparent reluctance by some of our regular clients to book as life slowly returned to normal after the rigours of the Covid Pandemic. The trustees agreed before the season started that we would not be offering our usual levels of refreshment, teas, coffees etc., nor would we be offering souvenirs to guests. This was to minimise close face to face interaction between crew and clients. However, it is sincerely hoped that this will not be necessary in 2023.

Dolphin III operated on a total of 83 days in 2022 during which a total of 963 passengers were carried, including 631 Persons with Disability and 332 Carers. There were 38 Wareham trips and 45 days of Harbour trips when a total of 76 trips were undertaken. We had to modify some of our trips to help clients cope with some of the exceptionally high temperatures which the country endured. The heatwave resulted in a couple of Wareham trips being shortened to a harbour trip as clients wished to minimise over exposure for their charges.

As with everybody else, during 2022 the impact of the instability in Eastern Europe and it effect on fuel prices was brought home to Dolphin volunteers when refuelling, with a "fill-up" exceeding



£500 a time. As a voluntarily funded charity this is our major running cost and we do not have the option of super-market forecourts to chase the best available price!

Dolphin III can only operate thanks to the team of volunteers who offer their time and expertise to crew her during the season. During 2022 we had a nominal Skipper list of eight, seven First mates and a further twenty-one crew, thirty six in total. The boat operates with a minimum of Skipper, First Mate and one crew, but whenever available we prefer to have a second crew member, making a total of four. Some crew prefer to have a set day per week, others cannot commit to every week but are happy to fill in as and when required. The system works! Across the 2022 season 31 of the enrolled personnel took part in at least one operational trip and the most active member attended on no less than 26 days. Typically most managed 10 to 15 days afloat in addition to training days before the season started. My thanks to each and every one of them.

However, we are always looking for new recruits at all levels as there is a compulsory retirement age of 75, and the vast majority of the team are only available because they are retired, which generates a continuous churn. Contact via the website or a personal introduction via an existing member of the team is equally effective. One notable retiree in 2022 was Skipper John Buckby. His contribution behind the scenes to conducting running repairs, co-ordinating maintenance and repairs as required, and generally "fettling" things without any fuss or drama will be sorely missed, and we wish him and Carol all the best for the future

Once again this winter Dolphin III is securely stored out of the water on the hard-standing at the Royal Motor Yacht Club – our thanks to them - and she will be back in the water in early April for crew to refamiliarise themselves and bring new recruits up to a basic level of readiness before the 2023 season commences on Tuesday 2 May. Of course, during the operating season we can only operate thanks to the hospitality of the Poole and District Fisherman's Association who generously provide us with a berth, and the Poole Quay Boat Haven marina which allows us to use their facilities to embark and disembark our passengers – again, our thanks to them too.

We look forward to welcoming you aboard in 2023!

#### **Fundraising Report 2023**

At last we enjoyed a full season on the water with some beautiful summer weather. As we were still wary of some post covid restrictions we did not make any sales on Dolphin but hopefully in 2023 we can resume these sales. We were however very successful in other areas in adding to our coffers.

We are ever grateful to those loyal supporters many of whom we have highlighted in the 'Thank You Corner' of the newsletter. It's certainly worth a mention that since we were adopted by the Rockfish Restaurant, Poole and appear on their menus, we have over three years received from them in excess of £4,500! Consequently we presented Rockfish with the Dolphin Trophy for a second year.

The Fundraising Bookstores introduced by Tesco Branksome and Ferndown were extremely successful, mainly due to the sterling efforts of Barbara Gardener and Margaret Newman in arranging book collections, liaising with the stores and achieving a sum of over £1,600.The two photos show Barbara and Margaret receiving cheques outside Tesco Ferndown from Jasmin Coates and on Dolphin from Karen of Tesco Branksome. We cannot thank Barbara and Margaret enough for all their hard work and then for arranging a super end of season

Quiz night with a Fish and Chip supper further totting up our coffers with an additional sum in excess of £800.



## **Dolphin Trophy**



Dolphin was founded as The Dolphin Project in 1979 by Parkstone Rotary Club, becoming The Friends of Dolphin Charity in 1982. The Friends of Dolphin was founded to take disabled people of all ages and disabilities, including those in wheelchairs, on free boat trips around the harbour and up the River Frome to Wareham. Since then over 50,000 disabled people with their carers have been taken on trips around the Harbour and up to Wareham. The Charity is run entirely by volunteers with costs approaching £15,000 a year, all of which is raised from voluntary contributions, donations and fundraising.

The Trophy, a Dolphin carved out of a single piece of wood was made and presented to The Friends of Dolphin by Harry Moyle (one of our skippers in the early days of Dolphin) in 1990, to be used as

the Trustees thought fit. They decided that it should be presented annually to a person or an organisation that has given significant support to the Charity.

This year, 2022, the Trophy was once again presented to Rockfish Seafood Restaurant (Poole) for their continuing support of Dolphin. Our photo shows the Manager of Rockfish Restaurants (Poole), receiving the trophy from our President Andy Preston with Tony Elgar our Chair of Fund Raising and one of the staff of the Restaurant, outside the restaurant on Poole Quay in September 2022.

Previous holders of the trophy include the Bournemouth Operatic Society, The Royal Marines (Poole), The Rotary Club of Parkstone, RNLI (Poole), Poole Haven Marina, Salterns Marina, Ken McKenzie, Poole Harbour Commissioners, Poole Yacht Club The Quay Thistle Hotel and Ferndown Golf Club, just to name but a few.
